# **Eligibility**

- 1. Junior or Senior Status
- 2. Cumulative GPA of 3.25 or above.
- 3. Show leadership in at <u>least one</u> of five phases of campus life:
  - -Scholarship
  - -Athletics
  - -Campus and Community Service, Social and Religious Activities, and Campus Government
  - -Journalism, Speech, and Mass Media
  - -Creative and Performing Arts
