WHAT TO BRING & WHAT NOT TO BRING

ENVIRONMENTALLY SUSTAINABLE SCHOOL SUPPLIES

What to bring:

- Cloth bags to tote your purchases from area shops and grocery stores.
- A bicycle. Chatham is a bike-friendly campus, and bikes are a convenient mode of transportation. No bikes may be stored in public area (ex. lounges, stairwells, etc.)
- Use reusable mugs and/or water bottle. You can purchase a Café Rachel mug and then you receive a discount on coffee when using it.
- Stereos, televisions, computers, lamps and other appliances are all available in Energy Star models, which reduce energy use significantly as compared to other models.
- Power Strips. Power strips cut down on vampire loads the power drain that occurs when an electronic device is turned "off" but still plugged into the electrical socket. Plugging such electronic equipment as cell phone chargers, stereos and computers into a power strip that can be shut off at night or when you are in class, saves energy.
- Compact fluorescent bulbs, an energy-saving alternative to incandescent bulbs.

What not to bring:

- A computer printer. Utilize on-campus printing sources.
- Incandescent bulbs. They use three times the power of compact fluorescent bulbs.

CLOTHES TO PACK

- Business casual outfit (i.e., khaki or cotton pants/skirts, polo shirt, button-up shirt, sweater or blouse, etc.)
- Casual daytime wear (i.e. jeans, pants, skirts, shorts, t-shirts, sweatshirt, etc.)
- Shoes (i.e. sneakers, dress shoes, etc.)
- Outerwear (including coat, gloves, hat, and scarf)

RESIDENCE LIFE ITEMS

Need to have item:

- closet hangers
- towels and wash cloths
- bed linens and blankets
- pocket sheets work too)
- alarm clock
- pillow(s)

- hair dryer
- personal care products
- desk lamp (not halogen)
- first aid kit
- laundry supplies
- mending kit

- umbrella and rain gear
- cups, silverware, bowls, etc.
- admission, financial aid, billing, and other college paperwork
- trash can
- surge protector/power strip

Smart to have items:

- television (check with your roommate(s) first!)
- calculator
- posters and pictures
- broom/dustpan or Swiffer
- stationery and stamps
- electric fan/ box fan
- door message board

- camera and accessories
- drying rack
- calendar
- stereo or radio with headsets
- poster putty or blue painter's tape
- address book
- over the door towel rack
- cell phone (we not have phone
- A Micro-Fridge unit (one allowed) per double or single and two per triple or quad, so be sure to check with your roommates – see below for more information or visit https://www.mymicrofridge.com)

PROHIBITED ITEMS:

You should NOT bring the following items, which are banned from the residence halls for safety reasons (Chatham University reserves the right to add items to this list as deemed necessary):

- pets (excluding aquarium fish and excluding approved service, emotional support and therapy animals)
- candles, incense & burner
- hot plate, toaster/toaster oven, or any other appliance with an exposed heating coil (permitted only in the Apartments)
- halogen lamps of any wattage
- space heater (unless provided by the University)
- air conditioner (unless approved for use)
- extension cords
- hover boards
- waterbeds, lofts, stacking furniture
- explosives, ammunition, flares, or other dangerous weapons (ex. pocket knives larger than 2 ½ inches long)

RESIDENCE HALL MICROWAVE & REFRIGERATOR RESTRICTIONS:

Students are not permitted to bring a microwave or refrigerator from home. Any incoming student who would like to have a microwave and/or refrigerator in their room will only permitted to rent a Micro-Fridge unit. These are a microwave refrigerator combination unit that can be rented from the Micro-Fridge company. Any student who rents a unit will have this unit delivered and installed prior to their arrival on-campus. At the end of the academic year the company will come and pick-up the unit.

Microwaves and community refrigerators are located in each residence hall. The cost for renting a unit is \$199.99 for the year and students have the option of buying optional insurance to cover any damages that the unit may encounter. We encourage all students to talk to their prospective roommate to decide your Micro-Fridge needs and to determine who is going to rent the unit.

Please note, students are limited to the number of Micro-Fridges they can have in their room. Students are not permitted to bring in their own refrigerators or microwaves. Listed below are the restrictions based on room occupancy for Micro-Fridge units:

- Single Room 1 Micro-Fridge Unit
- ▶ Double Room (Two Person Room) 1 Micro-Fridge Unit
- ▶ Triple or Quad Room (Three person or four-person room) 2 Micro-Fridge Units

RESIDENCE HALL LIVING

APARTMENT LIVING:

Students residing on the apartments located on lower campus on Fifth Avenue are permitted to bring kitchen appliances. Each apartment comes fully furnished with a bed, desk, dresser, couch, dining room table and chairs, and coffee table. The apartment is equipped with a kitchen that includes a refrigerator and stove. Students who live in the apartments are responsible for cleaning their own apartment.
